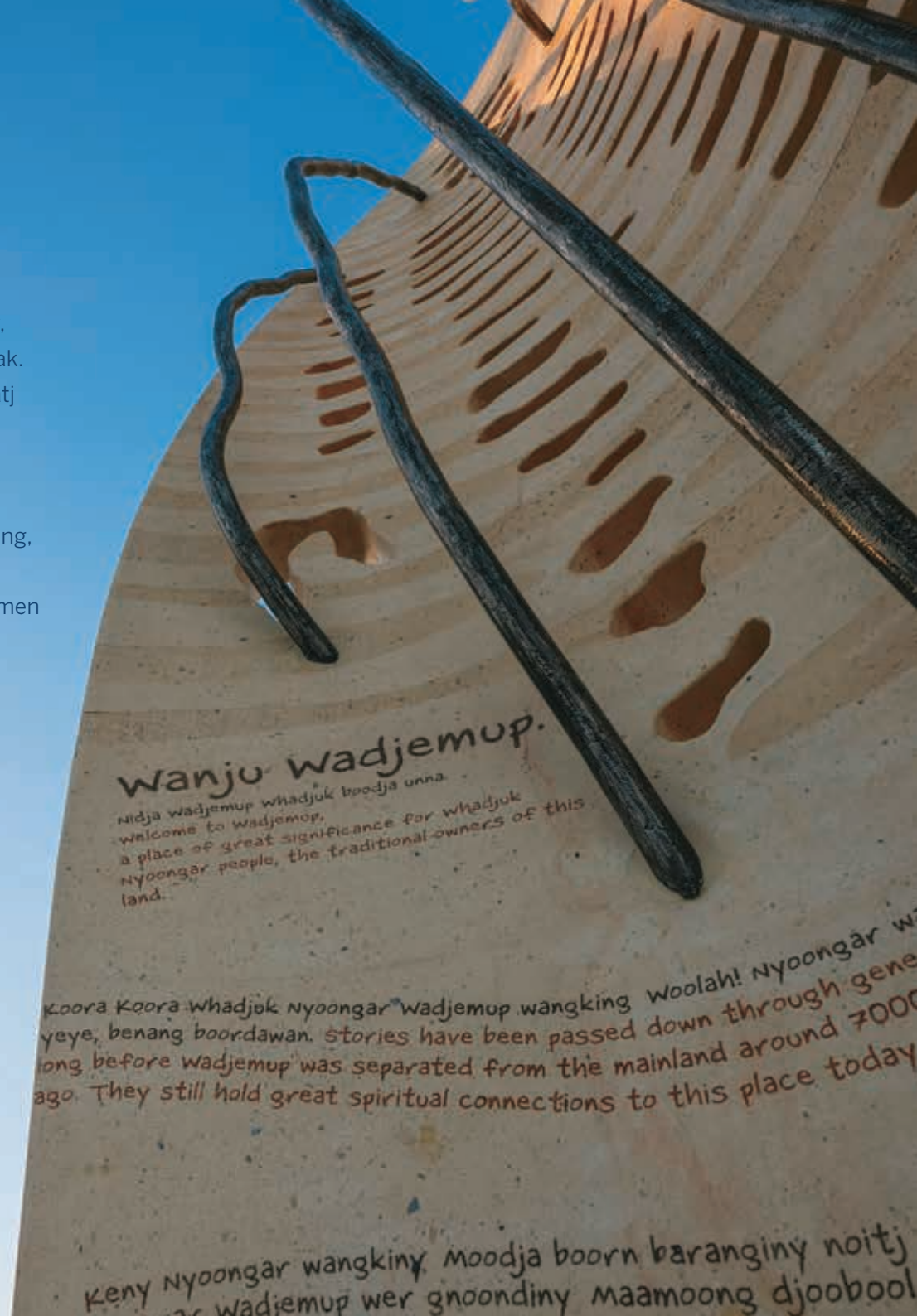
ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

For corporate groups, time spent on Wadjemup is all about connection and reinvigoration. This is an opportunity for teams to experience a fresh perspective away from daily responsibilities.

The island is just a 30-minute ferry from the coast of Western Australia. For a place so close to the bustling reality of the city, Wadjemup is a unique experience that offers corporate groups many options for finding connection and growth, no matter what sort of trip they are embarking on.

If you're looking for a specific plan for your team, you can find inspiration throughout this guide. There are lists of activities, island dining options, accommodation information, and example itineraries to help you map out your group's time on Rottnest Island.

A Little More About Wadjemup / Rottnest Island

Wildlife thrives on the island and, as you wander through the network of walking trails, you'll enjoy flora and fauna you can't find anywhere else. Spring brings the annual whale migrations where you can spot magnificent humpbacks breaching off the coast. And all year round you'll see the island's iconic populations of quokkas, impressive ospreys, and long-nosed fur seals in their colony at Cathedral Rocks.

Spending time on Wadjemup is about connecting with the land, feeling the past around you, and gaining a deeper understanding of those who came before you. This is where you can enter a completely different frame of mind; exhale and find joy in the new experiences offered to you and those you journey with.

GETTING TO WADJEMUP / ROTTNEST ISLAND

A Short Journey to Experience the Island Life

With only a short journey by air or ferry, visitors can immerse themselves in island life for a half-day, full-day, or overnight stay. While some choose to travel back to the mainland on the same day — making the most of every moment spent on Wadjemup / Rottnest Island — others extend their visit for as long as possible.

Travel by Ferry

Your group can travel to the island via ferries departing from Hillarys, Perth or Fremantle. With groups rates and hotel pickup options available, arrival to the island by ferry is the most popular form of travel.

Rottnest Express

Departing Fremantle or Perth — Transfers take approximately 30 or 90 minutes.

Rottnest Fast Ferries

Departing Hillarys Ferry Terminal — Transfers take approximately 45 minutes.

SeaLink Rottnest Island

Departing Fremantle or Perth — Transfers take approximately 30 minutes.

Travel by Air

Arriving by air makes the journey a special experience, as travellers descend with a spectacular view of the entire island laid out beneath them. These air transfers take about 10-20 minutes, depending on the departure point.

Air Charters West

One way or return flights (departing Bunbury Airport, and can include a champagne breakfast en route).

Corsaire Aviation

Helicopter (departing from Jandakot Airport, Perth) or helicopter charter (departing from Jandakot Airport, Crown Towers in Burswood, Hillarys Boat Harbour, and Fremantle).

Swan River Seaplanes

One way or return seaplane (departing from Jandakot Airport, Perth or the Swan River, South Perth).

Rottnest Air-Taxi

One way and return private flights (departing from Jandakot Airport, Perth).

WHEN TO VISIT

Experiences for Every Season

Wadjemup / Rottnest Island is a destination for any time of the year, with a Mediterranean climate.

During summer (December to February), Wadjemup / Rottnest Island's temperature hovers around the mid to high 20s (°C). The island is a welcome retreat from the often-higher temperatures of Perth city and the clear, turquoise bays provide ideal swimming and snorkelling spots.

In the cooler months, the island is a few degrees warmer than Perth, the average being a pleasant 19°C, with the Leeuwin Current flowing along the Western Australian coastline and making for refreshing winter swims. Spending time on Wadjemup / Rottnest Island during the winter months involves surfing at Salmon Bay, exploring meaningful historic sites, and walking amongst the natural world teeming with wildlife.



GETTING AROUND THE ISLAND

Explore Via Trail, Road, or Path

Wadjemup / Rottnest Island is predominantly car-free. In their absence, visitors take the local bus, ride bicycles, or simply walk around the island. This kind of unique, car-free experience is rare in the modern world, and why so many people are drawn to Rottnest Island year after year.

Travelling by Bus

Buses are a convenient way to get around the island. If you're keen to see the natural sights of Wadjemup, then a guided bus tour gives you the opportunity to sit back and take it all in.

Charter Bus

Hire your own bus to travel around the island and create your own itinerary. Get more information on the islands charter bus service options by calling (+61) 8 6270 6060.

Island Explorer Bus Service

Hop on-off bus service, with 19 stops around the island.

Quokka Hopper

The Quokka Hopper is a golf cart, an on-demand private transfer offering a convenient option to get around.

Accommodation Shuttle Bus

Stops at the accommodation in Geordie Bay, Longreach Bay, Fays Bay, and Kingstown Barracks.

By Bike

Cycling is the most common way to travel the island and take in the natural ecosystems.

Bikes can be hired from the island's three ferry companies when booking a ferry fare, or from Pedal & Flipper Hire on the island. Guided bike tours are also available through Paul's ECO e-Bike Tours.

By Foot

Rottnest Island is criss-crossed with a network of walking trails (the Wadjemup Bidi). There are five trails that, when combined, stretch to 45 kilometres, and give you a chance to wander self-guided amongst the lush island landscape. WADJEMUP'S UNPARALLELED EXPERIENCES

Create Memories and Gain Understanding

When corporate groups come to Wadjemup / Rottne Island, they may be searching for connection, new learnings, or even a break from the world of work.

Aquatic Explorations

Visitors to the island will find it tempting to interact with the ocean, as the pristine waters surround you and beckon you in. With 63 beaches and 20 bays, the land feels like it's just an entry point into the sea. Swim in the tranquil water of Geordie Bay, snorkel amongst diverse marine life at The Basin, or go for a surf at Salmon Bay.

Wanders in Nature

Wadjemup is a lesson in sustainability and nature preservation, and visitors are encouraged to treat the environment around them with respect. If you're keen to understand the inner workings of the island, stop by the solar farm, desalination plant, and wind turbine.

Outdoor activities are tailor-made for team building and there's plenty of unique landscape to explore with your group. Wander the network of walking trails and see the salt lakes, one-of-a-kind native flora, and breathtaking coastal views.



Unique Wildlife Observations

When you visit Wadjemup, it's almost like you enter another world and part of this comes from the wildlife. There are various interactions to be had on the island with iconic quokkas roaming about, migrating humpback whales passing by, long nosed fur seals living at Cathedral Rocks, and all sorts of birdlife to see above. Awe-inspiring and meaningful moments are easily found when observing the unique inhabitants of the island.

Cultural and Historical Revelations

Wadjemup has a layered, significant history and the past is etched into the buildings and land all around you. It's important to make time for a journey of understanding; visits to historic sites and the fascinating Wadjemup Museum. There are also opportunities for cultural experiences, like joining an Aboriginal tour with Go Cultural Aboriginal Tours and Experiences, where you'll gain a new perspective of the island and your time there.

Island Dining

The dining experiences available are just as unique and varied as the island's ecosystem. There's the iconic Rottne Bakery and other, more casual spots like Geordie's Café and Art Gallery, The Lane Café, and Dome Café. Even the more secluded spots around the island are catered with vintage caravans offering coffee, drinks, and snacks. For restaurant and bar experiences to remember (the stunning views perfectly matching the menu's delights), there's the likes of Isola Bar e Cibo, Pinky's Rottne Island, Lontara, and Hotel Rottne.

With so many options available, you can curate your group's dining experiences.

WHERE TO STAY

Let the Team Properly Recharge

Staying on Wadjemup / Rottnest Island for more than a day gives corporate groups the chance to settle into the rhythm of the island. There are various accommodation options for all budgets (with group rates offered by all accommodations) and desires, whether you're looking for a secluded getaway or an invigorating nature exploration.

Stay Rottnest Self-Contained

There are 292 self-contained units across different areas of the island available as shared accommodation with a single bathroom. They're all well-equipped and have different room configurations to suit each group.

Discovery Rottnest Island

Eco-friendly glamping is perfect for corporate groups looking to keep things sustainable and engage with nature. There's a bit of luxury in each of the 83 tents available; they include all the amenities of a hotel room, while maintaining the outdoorsy vibe. Tucked away behind sand dunes, you'll feel secluded, yet when it's time for team drinks Pinky's Beach Club is around the corner.

Stay Rottnest Hostel & Dorms

There are 50 beds, a fully equipped kitchen, and a lounge. It's an affordable spot to launch your team's activities, where you can choose to have separate rooms or embrace the dormitory style.

Governor Circle

Stay Rottnest Self Contained cottages near Kingstown Barracks, fitting 9–13 people and make for a comfortable, more private stay.

Samphire Rottnest

This resort is the place to pamper hard-working employees and give them the chance to decompress and recharge. Samphire Rottnest is the newest accommodation on the island with 80 rooms available, balconies with ocean views, lagoon-like pools, and a high-end restaurant.



GATHERING SPACES

A Unique Meeting Place

Wadjemup / Rottnest Island is an impressive spot to host corporate meetings, conferences, team building days, pre and post conference touring or workshops. The island landscape is an inspiring backdrop for your professional endeavours and encourages participants to stay present and involved. Venue Options

There are plenty of venue choices, from hotel rooms to heritage buildings:

Kingstown Barracks Rooms

A more casual option, the rooms in the historic Kingstown Barracks include a Main Hall (hold up to 150 people), Video Room (15-30 people), and several activity rooms for smaller groups.

Rottnest Island Golf Course

This well-equipped collaborative space is located at the Rottnest Island Golf Course, with a large meeting room (holds 100 people) and two outdoor spaces; perfect for bigger groups.

Samphire Rottnest

Elegant spaces inspired by coastal style to suit 50-300 guests, with catering options available. The Lontara Lounge is an outdoor setting for 50-120 guests. The Sea Deck offers beach side location for 80-170 guests. The Bayside and Bar is an indoor event space with an outdoor verandah for any style event, catering 50-300 guests.

The Picture Hall

Large hall with audiovisual equipment in relaxed, nostalgic setting (venue for Rottnest Movies).

The Peacock Inn

Located in a more secluded part of the island near Kingstown Barracks, it's a classroom-like venue suitable for 25-40 people.

Wadjemup / Rottnest Island is a self-sufficient place where you can detach from the mainland world for as long as you like, while still enjoying all the food and dining options you desire. There are group rates available and, with so much choice, you'll find an eatery that suits your needs, whether you're treating your team to a high-end meal at an oceanside restaurant or organising sustenance after an outdoor team-building activity.

Swimming, Snorkeling, and Kayaking

Charter 1

Submerging in the fresh, clear waters of Wadjemup is the best way to feel properly awakened. And to find the more hidden, truly idyllic swimming and snorkeling spots, you can take a tour on Charter 1 — the peaceful sailing catamaran. Enjoy a new vantage point for admiring the coastline of the island and interacting with marine life, and feel inhibitions melt away as you kayak, stand up paddleboard, and snorkel.

These eco-friendly vehicles add a bit of lighthearted fun to your tour of the island. Glide along discovering intriguing historical and environmental facts about the passing sights.

Walking Tours

Walking tours are one of the best ways to experience the island, as they provide many opportunities for quiet observation. Take your time to feel the shadows of the past around you and interact with the wildlife and unique landscape.

The Hike Collective Walking Tours

There's an extensive network of walking trails across the island called the Wadjemup Bidi and The Hike Collective offers bespoke guided tours if you would like that expert insight. As a private tour, your group can plan what parts of Wadjemup they would most like to explore — perhaps the idyllic coastline or the thriving inland bush and salt lakes. The tours cater for all ages and abilities, with options for three to 35-kilometre hikes.

Aboriginal Tours and Experiences on Wadjemup

Go Cultural Aboriginal Tours and Experiences

One of the most meaningful experiences you can have on Wadjemup / Rottnest Island is an Aboriginal tour of the island. It's a way to pay respect to the complex history of the place and expand your understanding of what Wadjemup means for the local Noongar people. Go Cultural Aboriginal Tours and Experiences offers a cultural walking tour that includes a traditional sand ceremony, Dreamtime stories, songs, and Noongar language.

- Departure point: Rottnest Island Visitor Centre
- Duration: 1 to 2 hours
- Maximum number of people: 150
- Seasonal availability: Tours operate from September to July

Bus Tours

A bus tour is an easy, accessible way to explore the island and take in the breathtaking sights (no matter the weather).

Quokka Coaches Bayseeker Island Tour

This bus tour is an in-depth look at the island, stopping at all the most impressive attractions; including both restful, historic places like Wadjemup Lighthouse and stunning, natural spots like Cathedral Rocks. Listen to a knowledgeable commentary as the bus sweeps through the peaceful landscape.

- Departure point: Main Bus Stop, Thomson Bay Settlement
- Duration: 1.75 hours
- Maximum number of people: 34- or 42-seater buses available — multiple tours per day available upon request
- Seasonal availability: Operates all year round

Rottnest Express Discover Bus Tour

This bus tour has the most insightful commentary shining a light on the island's flora and fauna stopping at two key vantage points — Wadjemup Lighthouse and the West End.

- Duration: 1.5 hours
- Maximum number of people: Two buses, 34 on each bus — multiple tours per day available upon request
- Seasonal availability: Operates all year round
